

Articulation Agreement Between Oakland University and Macomb Community College For a Bachelor of Science in Applied Health Science

<u>About Applied Health Science (AHS):</u> Earn a Bachelor of Science degree by efficiently combining meaningful health science and leadership courses with your specific Associate of Applied Sciences (AAS) degree from an accredited community college.

<u>Health Care Leadership Track:</u> Advance your career in leadership potential with the Health Care Leadership (HCL) track. 2. Health Promotion Track:

*Applicable MCC Courses (choose 1 course, may also be used for MTA requirement): BIOL 1400, CHEM 1170, CHEM 1180, HHSC 1700, PHYS 1180, PHYS 1190, WHES 2070, WHES 2085, WHES 2181.

Notes:

- 120 total credits to complete OU Bachelor of Science in Applied Health Science degree. For students pursuing the Health Care Leadership track a minimum 38 credit hours need to be completed at OU where 32 of the 38 credits are at the 3000-4000 level. For students pursuing the Health Promotion Track that choose to take the additional applicable course at MCC, a minimum 35 credits hours need to be completed at OU where 32 of the 35 credits are at the 3000-4000 level.
- The Knowledge Applications General Education requirement is automatically completed if pursuing the Leadership Track. When choosing the Health Promotion Track please meet with an academic adviser at OU to determine if it's best to take this requirement at OU or at MCC.
- Submit official transcripts showing AAS degree and all coursework completed with a minimum 2.0 GPA.
- Concurrent enrollment in a community college AAS program and Oakland University's AHS program is not permitted.
