#### **MAJOR REQUIREMENTS**

Oakland University Requirements	Muskegon Community College Options
COM 2000	COM 101 or 201

**Language Co-requisite** (select one of the following options):

An introductory two-semester foreign language sequence <b>OR</b> an introductory two-semester sign language sequence	CHIN, FR, GER, SPAN 101 <u>and</u> 102; <i>OR</i> ASL 101 <u>and</u> 102
One second semester (or higher) foreign language course <i>OR</i> one second semester (or higher) sign language course	CHIN 102; FR, GER 102, <b>201</b> or <b>202</b> ; SPAN 102, 150, <b>201</b> or <b>202</b> <b>OR</b> ASL 102

**Major Electives** 

Choose 3 courses (not already completed above):	ASL 101, 102; COM 101, 201

Community College courses that are equivalent to 3000-level OU courses **do not count** toward the minimum 20 credits in 3000-4000 level **COM** courses that are required for the **Communication** major (consult with OU adviser to plan how to fulfill the 3000-4000 level requirement with appropriate course selection).

Students may transfer an unlimited amount of credit from Muskegon, and must complete a minimum of 45 credit hours from OU to meet degree requirements. As programs may limit the transfer credits that can be used toward requirements, it is highly recommended that students work with both an OU (school/college) academic adviser and their Muskegon counselor to maximize the applicability of coursework to specific requirements.

### TRANSFERRING WITH THE MICHIGAN TRANSFER AGREEMENT (MTA):

When choosing to complete MTA to satisfy General Education, please confirm the best courses to take to fulfill the agreement with your academic adviser at Muskegon or at the <u>Muskegon MTA</u> website. To best complete OU's transferable General Education requirements, please reference the <u>Muskegon Community College General Education Transfer Guide</u> and take the following:

- One course from OU's Writing Foundations category
  (this serves as an MTA English Composition course and is a prerequisite for coursework at OU)
- One course from OU's Knowledge Applications category (this category met when a 200-level language course or COM 107 is chosen above)

### TRANSFERRING WITHOUT MTA:

If you intend to transfer without MTA, you can choose to complete additional coursework to fulfill OU's individual General Education categories instead. ## **EXPLORATORY REQUIREMENT:**

Students with majors in the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) must satisfy an exploratory requirement. This can be done by completing a double major or a CAS minor or concentration; or by completing a minimum of 12 credits in a single CAS rubric, outside of their major rubric. For additional options visit oakland.edu/exploratory . Please confirm transfer course choices with an OU CAS adviser. Students using MTA or MACRAO must complete the exploratory requirement at Oakland University or another four-year institution.





### NOTES:

Oakland University will always honor the **MACRAO transfer agreement** and apply it to the General Education requirement the same as MTA.

The College of Arts and Sciences requires that a minimum of 16 credits in the major be completed at Oakland University.
