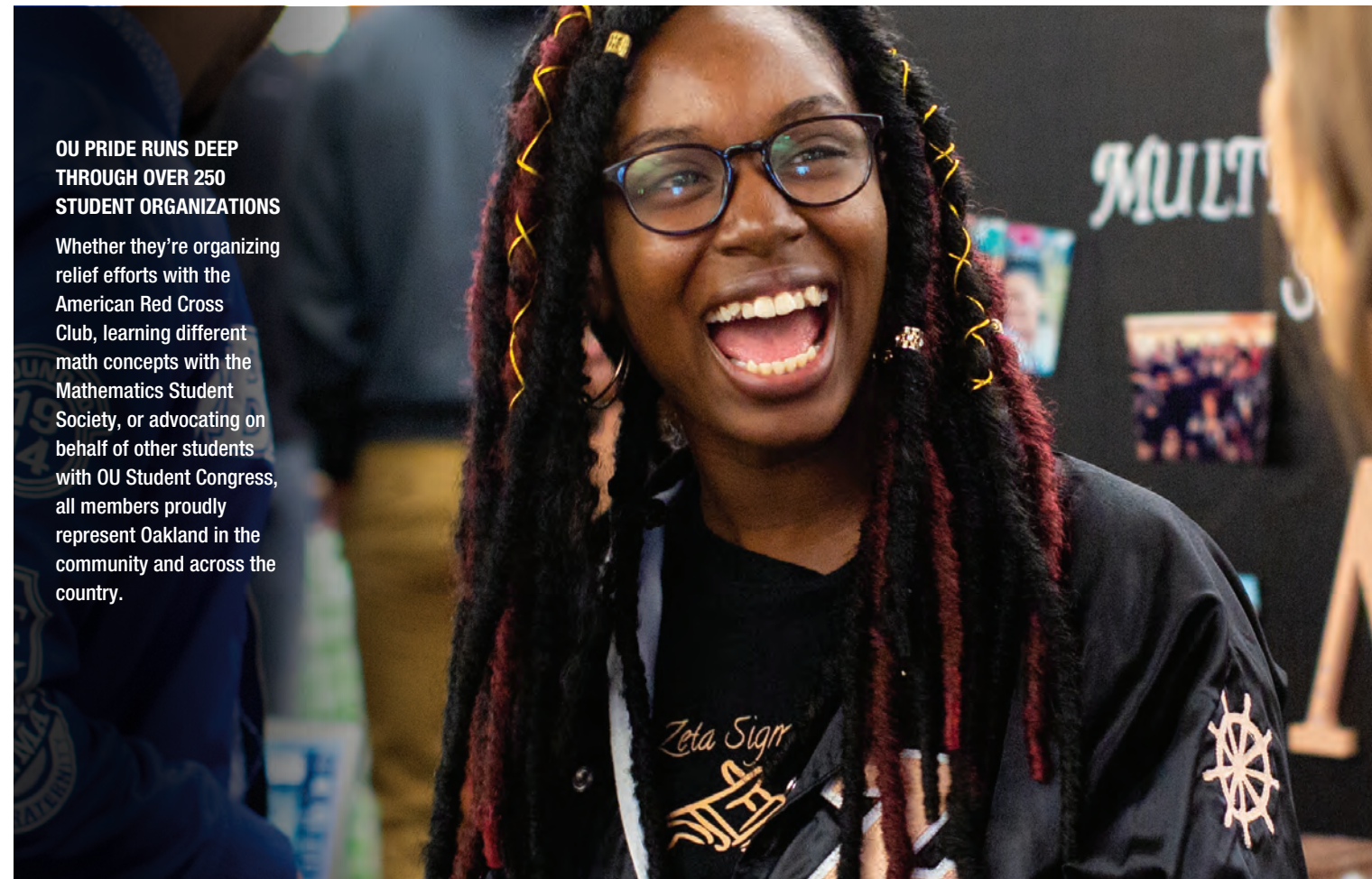

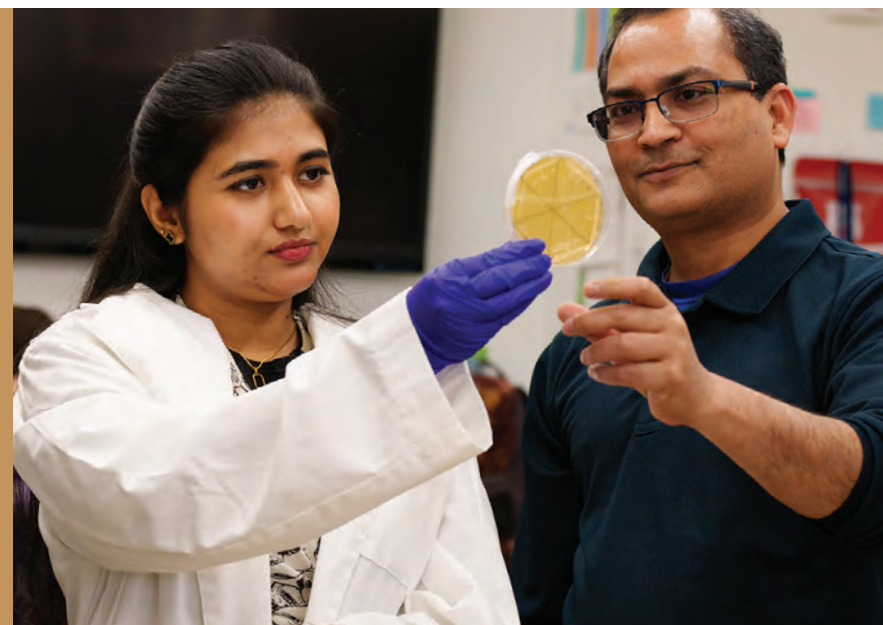

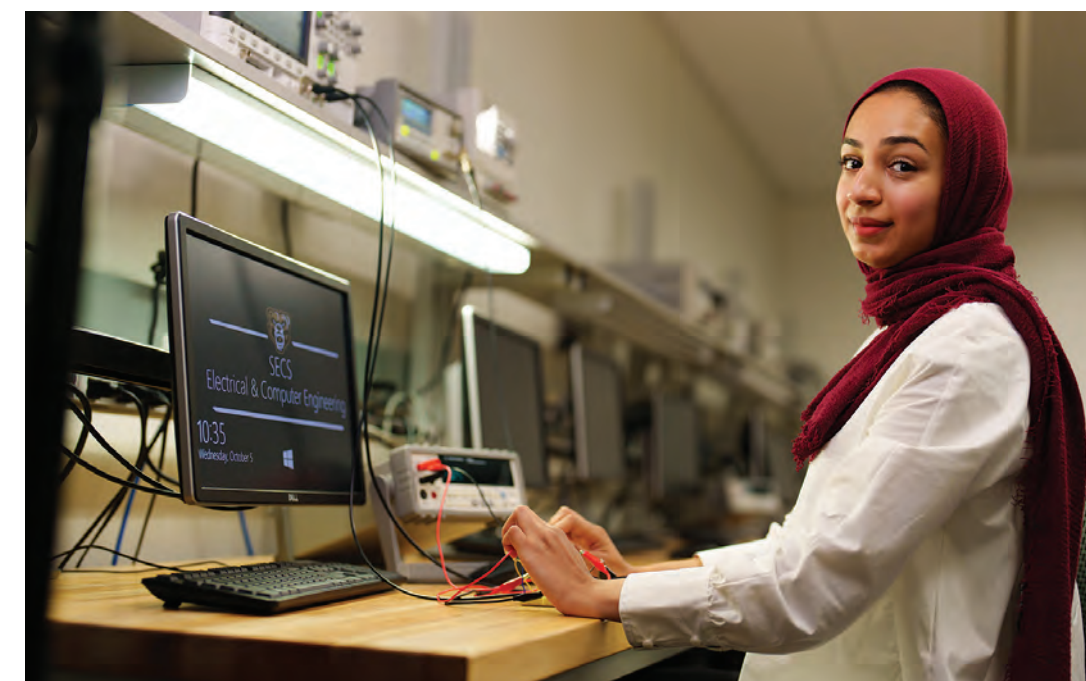

STEP 1

Follow the detailed instructions at oakland.edu/international for applying. Graduate students should follow the instructions at oakland.edu/grad/how-to-apply/international-students.

STEP 2

Create an admissions login at oakland.edu/apply and record your login information so you can check your application status. For graduate applicants, visit oakland.edu/grad/how-to-apply.

STEP 3

Complete the application. You can apply to OU at any point in the year, but we suggest you submit all the required information, including transcripts and test scores, by these deadlines:

STEP 4

We welcome students from all over the world. International students can come to OU as a/an:

- **Undergraduate student.** Students who are degree-seeking and who have met the English proficiency requirement.
- **Undergraduate GAPP student.** The Global Achievement Pathways Program (GAPP) allows students to come to OU with lower English proficiency and begin academic study for a degree while taking English classes.
- **ESL student.** Students who need to improve their English proficiency before applying for a degree program.
- **ASAP student.** The American Semester Abroad Program (ASAP) allows undergraduate and graduate students to study abroad at Oakland for a semester or a year and transfer credits back to their home university. Students can also come to take preparatory classes and apply to an Oakland degree program during their ASAP semester or year.

Preparing for study abroad can feel both exciting and overwhelming — and raise a lot of questions. From housing to health insurance and everything in between, OU's international advisers are here to help you every step of the way. Here are the top five questions our international students ask before arriving at OU.

When do I need to be at OU?

You will arrive at Oakland University before the mandatory international orientation, which is scheduled a few days before the start of the semester.

Can I work on-campus and off-campus?

As an international student, you are eligible for any on-campus job. During the school year, you can work part time (20 hours a week), while you can work full time (up to 40 hours a week) during breaks. Off-campus employment, known as "Curricular Practical Training," or CPT, is offered to students who have been in F-1 status for at least eight months (two semesters), and only if the off-campus job is related to their field of study.

What is full-time enrollment?

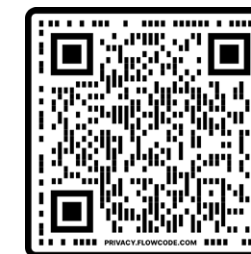
Full-time means 12 credits for undergraduate students and eight credits for graduate students (or nine credits for graduate students in the School of Business Administration). F-1 students must be enrolled full time during the fall and winter semesters.

How do I obtain health insurance, and how much does it cost?

As an F-1 or J-1 international student, you are required to purchase the university-sponsored health insurance plan, UnitedHealthcare (UHC) Student Resources. For 2023-24, the Student Health Insurance Plan costs \$1,930 annually.

How do bill payments work?
